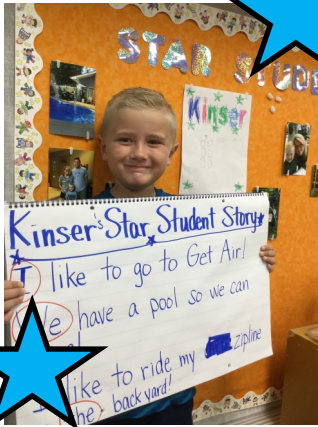

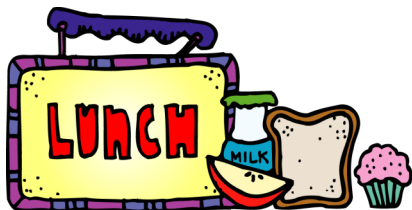

In math we are working on numbers to 5. Most of us know our numbers to 5 but are now fine tuning how to write those digits to 10 and beyond. We have a number chant song that helps us write our numbers correctly and we enjoyed this routine. We also are thinking quick about numbers called subitizing with different math routines and did some problem solving on Wednesday together. We are beginning to count objects carefully to represent the number and more!

In social studies this week we talked about our families, a group where we each belong. We learned that some families are big and some are small but that all families should love and care for each other. We made a family art project to hang in the hall.
